Thank you for allowing me to share some comments regarding the removal of the Haiku Stairs. Being in direct line of fire to the multiple trespassers/illegal hikers (my property butts up to access road, and drainage canal) I am in favor of total removal of the Stairs. Unwanted groups of trespassers / illegal hikers pass through our property at all hours of the day, showing blatant disregard for private property and signage stating to keep out. One night last month, my daughter was shocked and frightened to see a group of 4 trespassers/illegal hikers 5 feet from her bedroom window as she changed clothes.
