RAIN BARREL WATER CATCHMENT

Halawa Xeriscape Garden Workshop

- **WHAT:** An informational workshop offered by the Board of Water Supply (BWS) and Friends of Halawa Xeriscape Garden (FOHXG) explains how collecting rain water reduces the amount of drinking water used for irrigating landscapes. Participants will learn about rain barrel catchment systems, important construction points, installation, and effective maintenance techniques.

- WHERE: Halawa Xeriscape Garden 99-1268 Iwaena Street Halawa Valley's Central Park Industrial Area



COST: \$35.00 fee includes class lecture and one pre-drilled, 55-gallon water catchment barrel with one hose bib to be transported and installed by the participant.

*Lecture only: \$5.00 for non-members. FOHXG members may receive a discount on the lecture fee (Free for supporting level or above)

DETAILS: Rain Barrel Catchment is an effective technique for outdoor water conservation. Rain barrels are used to collect rain water outside a structure that can be used for outdoor purposes, such as watering landscapes, which helps save water and save money.

> One rain barrel per household is available only to those who attend the lecture. Participants must have a vehicle large enough to transport the barrel--no delivery or storage services are available.
