**ANNUAL POSTER AND POETRY CONTESTS  
CHALLENGE STUDENTS TO CONSERVE TO PRESERVE**

*Deadline for Water Conservation Week contests is March 1*

HONOLULU – The Board of Water Supply (BWS) is seeking entries for its 2017 Water Conservation Week Poster and Poetry Contests. The deadline for both contests is Wednesday, March 1, 2017. These annual contests focus on educating Oahu’s students about the significance of water conservation and what they can do to help preserve our limited resources.

“Over time, these yearly contests are helping to develop tomorrow’s leaders who embrace a water-smart lifestyle and, in doing so, contribute to a sustainable future for the City and County of Honolulu,” said Honolulu Mayor Kirk Caldwell.

The 39<sup>th</sup> annual poster contest is open to Oahu students in grades K-6, while the 9<sup>th</sup> annual poetry contest is open to Oahu students in grades 7-12. The 2017 contest theme, “Conserve to Preserve,” invites Oahu students to creatively express the importance of conserving water now to preserve our water supply for the future.

“We are pleased to offer Oahu’s youth the chance to exhibit their drawing and writing skills as they share their thoughts on how all of us can help protect our island’s precious water resources,” said BWS Chair Bryan Andaya.

BWS Manager and Chief Engineer Ernest Lau stated, “Each year, we look forward to reviewing and judging the numerous contests’ entries we receive as they reflect much thought and effort from each student on the vital topic of water conservation. Meanwhile, students learn that making small changes in their daily habits can ensure that our groundwater supply continues to meet our needs for generations to come.”

Students entering the poster contest should submit one original piece of artwork that expresses the theme on a 12 x 18-inch sheet of paper. Any art medium can be used except 3-dimensional work, chalk, charcoal, and oil-based crayons.

Students entering the poetry contest should submit one original poem, typed on a standard 8½ x 11-inch letter size paper. The poem must also reflect the theme and be 150 words or less and no longer than 20 lines. Any form of poetry is acceptable.



Entries must be submitted with a completed entry form by **March 1, 2017**, to the BWS's Communications Office at 630 South Beretania Street, Monday through Friday, 7:45 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., or to any Satellite City Hall on Oahu (except Hickam) during their normal business hours. The winning and honorable mention posters and poems will be showcased at different venues across the island in 2017, as well as featured in the 2018 Water Conservation Calendar, which will be made available to the public at the end of the year. In May, the winning students will be recognized at a special ceremony and presented with awards.
