



# Proclamation

**WHEREAS**, O‘ahu’s precious water resources contribute to our prosperous economy, protect the health and welfare of residents, and enhance our high standard of living; and

**WHEREAS**, the availability of these resources has been significantly reduced by the shutdown of three Board of Water Supply (BWS) sources near Red Hill due to the U.S. Navy’s jet fuel spill last year and declining annual average rainfall this year; and

**WHEREAS**, to ensure the sustainability of decreased water supply, it is absolutely vital to be a responsible water steward and use only what you need; and

**WHEREAS**, in the national observance of “Imagine A Day Without Water” on October 20, 2022, the importance of using water efficiently will be recognized; and

**WHEREAS**, the local observance is a collaborative effort of the City and County of Honolulu’s BWS, Department of Facility Maintenance, Storm Water Quality branch, Department of Environmental Services; the State of Hawai‘i’s Department of Land and Natural Resources Commission on Water Resource Management, Division of Forestry and Wildlife; the University of Hawai‘i’s College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources; and the County of Hawai‘i, and Kaua‘i water utilities; and

**WHEREAS**, on October 19 at noon, participating departments and agencies will share their knowledge and experience on the importance of water reuse – a method to repurpose and treat stormwater, wastewater, and graywater, in a live, interactive, virtual One Water Forum; and

**WHEREAS**, on October 20, participating departments and agencies will educate the general public about the value of water and how it plays an integral role with each agency and offer prizes at booths in Tamarind Park and Kapolei Hale from noon to 1 p.m.,

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICK BLANGIARDI**, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, do hereby proclaim October 20, 2022, to be
