Aloha mai kākou e nā hoa makamaka mai ka lā hiki a ka lā kau. Welina nui me ke aloha!

Mahalo nui no kēia 'ākoakoa 'ana o kākou no ka pono o ka lāhui, no ka pono o ka 'āina, a no ka pono o ka wai nō ho'i. Eia he 'ōlelo no'eau e kālele ana i ke ko'iko'i o ka wai.

Chair Anthony translated the 'olelo no'eau: Aloha from the rising to the setting sun. Thank you all for coming together today for the people, the land, and the water. Here is a short Hawaiian Proverb that helps us remember the importance of fresh water and land.

'Ōlelo 1149: I 'aina no ka 'ãina i ke ali'i, a i waiwai no ka 'aina i ke kanaka.

Chair Anthony translated 'ōlelo 1149: The land remains the land because of the chiefs, and prosperity comes to the land because of the common people. Chiefs are needed to hold the land, and commoners are needed to work the land.

Chair Anthony welcomed everyone to the January 27, 2025, Regular Meeting of the Board of Water Supply (BWS). He stated that the Board of Water Supply is dedicated to providing safe, dependable, and affordable supply of water now and into the future.

Before continuing the meeting, Chair Anthony stated that a recording would be played to share reminders for public participation and the virtual meeting regulations required by law.

DISCUSSION:


Michele L. Thomas, Executive Assistant, Human Resources Office, gave the report.

Chair Anthony asked, compared to other County Departments how the percentage of vacant positions for BWS compares.

Ms. Michele Thomas replied that the BWS's vacancies are the average norm. The BWS does well filling general vacant positions. However, the BWS struggles to fill highly specialized positions such as engineers and skilled trades. The BWS uses various strategies to attract potential candidates and to retain current employees, including promoting staff development training, allowing those with little to no experience to have opportunities in the long term.

Chair Anthony asked what strategy or type of advertisement has been most fruitful in gaining recruits.

Ms. Thomas stated that there are five generations in the workforce; therefore, different outreach is required. The younger generations are inclined to use social media, whereas the older generations prefer face-to-face contact.



Subject: Status Update of Groundwater Levels at All Index Stations

Three aquifer index stations were in low groundwater condition for the production month of December 2024. Waialua and Punalu'u are in Caution Status. Kaimukī is in Alert Status. The monthly production average for December 2024 was 137.21 million gallons per day.

The Board of Water Supply rainfall index for the month of December 2024 was 17 percent of normal, with a 5-month moving average of 68 percent. As of January 7, 2025, the Hawai'i Drought Monitor shows drought conditions across the entire island of O'ahu, with moderate drought conditions over most of the island, grading to extreme drought conditions along the leeward coast.

The National Weather Service had been forecasting above-normal precipitation through March 2025; they are currently forecasting above-normal precipitation in January 2025, with no predictions further ahead in time. Their Precipitation Summary for December 2024 notes that "December is usually one of the wettest months of the year across the State of Hawai'i. Long range projections generated in early Fall 2024 favored above normal precipitation for the month. The end result painted a very different picture, with below average December totals at most locations across the main Hawaiian Islands. Drought areas increased in size and intensity instead of easing. Rather than low-pressure systems nearby producing episodes of heavy rain, many days in December featured stable conditions with a surface ridge of high pressure over or just north of the state."

Monitoring wells exhibited an almost equal number of stable, slightly increasing, and slightly decreasing head levels for the month of December 2024. This likely reflects combined effects of increased production relative to the prior month but lower than summer maximums,

and significantly low rainfall following two months of higher/above normal rainfall. Average monthly production for December 2024 is higher than November 2024 and higher than the 5-year monthly average.



DISCUSSION:

Barry Usagawa, Program Administrator, Water Resources Division, gave the report.

Chair Anthony stated that the BWS has closely watched Kaimuki since its head levels reached critical. He asked what the BWS must do to recover from being in critical. Chair Anthony also inquired if more water is being used than produced, what the BWS does to obtain the water to accommodate the demand.

Head Report




Mr. Barry Usagawa explained that the Kaimuki production was decreased to three million gallons per day (mgd) from a permitted used of 4.0 mgd, which helped raise the head levels. Kāimukī has since moved up into alert. During the summer, Kaimuki can produce up to five mgd.

Chair Anthony asked if the two mgd remaining are held in the reserves for use when necessary.

Mr. Usagawa replied yes. He mentioned that Halawa Shaft's shutdown has caused additional stress on Beretania and other low-service sources. However, the BWS has been able to keep up with demand and maintain its use to three mgd.


Chair Anthony referred to the monthly production graph and stated that the monthly average has been tracked to be relatively the same as in previous years; however, the monthly production was higher due to low rainfall in December 2024. He inquired when would it be necessary to issue a water shortage mandate.



Mr. Usagawa stated that the BWS rules allow the BWS to declare a low groundwater condition if three or more index stations are in alert or critical. He stated that the BWS could declare a low groundwater situation if it were facing the same situation as in 2003 when there were nine index stations in low groundwater, and Punalu'u was in critical. Mr. Usagawa shared that since then, the BWS has cut back its production at Punalu'u due to chloride levels. In 2008, the windward also experienced low groundwater levels due to its smaller dike storage.

Mr. Usagawa mentioned that the BWS Water Shortage Plan is available on its website. He stated that pumping units online will experience the highest levels during the summer months as they reach their maximum threshold of 20 to 22 hours a day of pumping. He explained that pumping up to 20 hours a day is considered alert status, and pumping up to 22 hours a day would be considered critical status; therefore, the BWS could declare a water shortage based on pump run times when demand rises. If a water shortage is declared, the BWS would implement progressively stricter conservation measures to reduce water demand and protect the aquifers.

Manager Lau shared that if conservation is needed, the BWS sends reminder letters to the top 200 water users, such as multi-family homes, high rises, and the Marine Corps base. He stated that as the Manager of the BWS for almost 13 years, he has never seen rainfall so low in December at 17% of normal.



Manager Lau referred back to the monthly production graph and stated that the BWS will have to monitor very closely. In December 2024, the blue indicates that the monthly production was much higher than what was measured at the same time in 2023, as shown in green.

Chair Anthony commented that the December 2023 and 2024 comparison is quite significant.

Mr. Usagawa also commented, hopefully, January will bring more consistent rainfall.
